If there are still places available on a course this will be shown in the course information on our website, or alternatively you can ring and check beforehand. Some courses require you to attend an initial assessment session to ensure you are enrolling onto the most suitable course for you, but we'll make that clear in the course details if this is the case.

Are classes reliant on size?

Yes. If numbers are too low the course may be cancelled or re-arranged to another time.

I'd love to do a course but I can't afford it. Can you help?

We want our courses to be within reach of all adults, so you may be eligible for financial support if you are on a low income or receive income-related benefits. This could include help with childcare, travel costs, exam fees, books, costs of field trips and tuition fees under certain circumstances.

What if I have a disability, learning difficulty, health issue or other support needs?

If there is anything you think you may need support with you can indicate this when you enrol.

Do you choose accessible venues?

I might need help with my maths and/or English? Is that ok?

If you would like support with English and/or maths you can indicate this when you enrol.

Course Fees and Support

How are courses funded?

The WEA receives public funding from the Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA) for the majority of our courses. This funding supplements the fees paid by students and sponsors. For most of our courses, this funding is only available for people who are 19 or over.

Are some courses free?

For ESFA funded courses, you are entitled to free tuition if you receive certain benefits, as listed below (or if you are dependent on someone who receives those benefits). You may be asked for evidence of your benefit status such as a letter from Job Centre Plus.

- ▶ Job Seekers Allowance
- ▶ Employment and Support Allowance (ESA - work related)
- ▶ Universal Credit and earn less than £330 per month
- ▶ Income Support, Housing Benefit, Council Tax Reduction (not single occupancy discount) or Employment and Support Allowance (ESA) support group
- ▶ Working Tax Credit
- ▶ Pension Guarantee Credit
- ▶ Asylum Seeker

Please note these may be subject to change due to funding requirements.

What does a course cost?

For students who are required to pay a fee for their courses, fees are shown against each course or on the page where the course appears. All students will be asked to provide their date of birth at the time they enrol. This information is required by our funders.

What if I'm new to the UK?

Students who have not been resident in the UK/EU for the last 3 years will be required to complete a Student Eligibility Form and provide appropriate evidence.

Can I apply for a loan?

Yes. There are Advanced Learning Loans available for all students aged 19 and above studying vocational, technical and professional qualifications at Level 3 and above.

Can I cancel my course?

Can I pay by instalment?

Walking back to happiness

After living with mental health issues that left him feeling isolated and depressed for 15 years, David has transformed his life through the Reach Out Project walking group.

"I used to feel the world was a big bad place – nobody was worth bothering with and nobody bothered with me. Being with the WEA and tutors helped a lot. Soon I was feeling more human and more of an adult: instead of being put down, I felt more confident to start mixing with people again."

Walking in the woods, seeing nature and meeting people is far more beneficial to your mental health than sitting in the house, looking out of the window and locking yourself away. These days, I take regular walks instead of taking lots of anti-depressants. Getting out in nature is exactly what we need to feel happy and healthy."
