Course description

This could be the first step towards making and selling your own clothes, so if you love fashion and textiles, take your passion to the next level.

During this course, you will learn how to:

- improve your skill in taking measurements
- manage commercial patterns

- prepare fabric for cutting
- use a sewing machine
- stitch fabric,
- making seams, necks and buttonholes
- inserting zip

As you progress throughout the course, you learn to use an overlocker to create a professional finish and widen your knowledge of fabrics.

Make at least one garment and produce samples, recordings and photos for your folder (online and on paper) every week.
