Continue developing English skills to help you in work and everyday life situations. This functional skills English Entry Level 2 course teaches you skills for reading, writing, and communicating in English. Learn how to improve your writing skills and build on the basic reading skills from Entry Level 1. Adult English courses teach you practical communication skills to help you get a job or study. Develop your English skills through real-life situations. This course teaches you tools and resources to improve your use of English in new and familiar situations. These skills can help you succeed in your studies, professional situations, and social interactions. This is a government-funded accredited English course for adults. Functional Skills qualifications are free if you don't already have a GCSE in English or Maths at grades A*-C, or 4-9. We'll check your level and any previous qualifications before you start. This ensures you are on the correct course.

Course description

What we'll cover

- Listen to explanations and extract details and key information
- Contribute to group discussions about a range of topics and communicate your feelings and opinions clearly
- Use resources such as dictionaries to understand the meaning of short texts and be able to read compound sentences
- Use basic punctuation and spell regular plurals correctly
- Learn to use adjectives and connectors to create compound sentences
- Complete forms asking for personal information correctly

Entry 2 functional skills English courses teach you essential English skills for employment and learning. They are made by adults, for adults.

When you finish the entry 2 functional skills English course, you will have assessments in three areas. They are: Speaking, listening, and communicating, Reading, and Writing.

Once you pass entry 2 you can progress to entry 3. There are “get ready” courses between each level to help you prepare for the next course.

Before you can enrol on this course, you’ll need to do a skills check. Don’t worry, this isn’t an exam. It’s for us to make sure you get on the right course for your level.

Our friendly team will contact you to start your skills check as part of your booking.

What to expect

This entry 2 English course for adults takes around 60 hours to complete.

English functional skills courses are accepted as a GCSE equivalent for many jobs and courses. At level 2, they can help you do an apprenticeship, higher education course, or go to University.

Functional skills English courses are ideal for flexible learning. You can choose to take an in-person or online functional skills course. You can also do assessments online if you like.
