This course will help you identify the words and focus on the meaning instead of hearing a stream of meaningless sounds. You will also learn a lot about the country you live in and the opportunities that surround you. This course is FREE if you are employed and on a low wage or you are claiming benefits. Learners will be encouraged to use their English and gentle tasks such as using questions will be used to facilitate this. Drinks will be provided throughout and learners will be given full support to explore their next steps within the WEA, such as attending future Community Learning ESOL courses, or even progress onto accredited ones.
