The **Get Started** range of courses and tasters aim to build confidence and self-esteem. Students can move to the **Develop** range of courses. Some students may wish to start at the **Develop** stage.

Get Started

- ▶ **What is care work? - Taster**
- ▶ **Introduction to dementia - Taster**
- ▶ **Introduction to working with vulnerable adults - Taster**
- ▶ **Introduction to learning disabilities - Taster**

Develop

- ▶ **Introduction to working with vulnerable adults – 9 hours**
For anyone who wants to work with adults in voluntary or charity sectors.
- ▶ **Introduction to working in healthcare, adult care and childcare – 27 hours**
Discover the values, principles, skills and attitudes required for working in health, adult care and childcare.
- ▶ **Introduction to health and safety - 18 hours**
Find out about health and safety regulations and how to implement them in the workplace.
The above 3 introductory courses can be studied as stand alone units (non accredited) or together for a level 1 City and Guilds Award in Employability (54 hours).

- ▶ **L1 Award in Preparing to Work in Adult Social Care – 60 hours**

This course provides students with an insight into the adult social care sector. Students will achieve a recognised industry care level 1 qualification.

Moving On

- ▶ **L2 Certificate in Preparing to Work in Adult Social Care – 179 hours**

This course provides students with basic concepts of caring and preparation for employment in the sector.

- ▶ **Confidence to study - 26 hours**

Identify key study skills for further study at level 3 and above.
